Development of Scrapbook for Teaching Descriptive Texts at SMA Sains Plus Tahfidz Qur'an Al Ammar

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Abstract. The objective of this research was to develop scrapbook for teaching descriptive text. This research used Model of Development. It was undertaken to develop scrapbook for teaching descriptive text. To gain the purpose, it was needed a research approach that highlights an effort to produce the teaching writing media. Therefore, in designing the model, the researcher used Research and Development approach by adapting Borg and Gall Model. The subject of this research were students of SMA Sains Plus Tahfidz Qur'an Al Ammar at the grade XI in the academic year of 2022/2023. The researcher used two data collection techniques, they were descriptive qualitative data and quantitative data. Qualitative data and quantitative results were obtained from questionnaire validation expert, reviews of material expert and teaching media expert. The data was from the field trials obtained from the comments or responses, questionnaire result and test results. The instruments of data collection were gathered by administrating interview and distributing questionnaire to 22 respondents to get students' needs. The mean of the questionnaire related to the materials appropriateness is 3.7. The mean value falls into "Good" category since it is in the interval 3.4 < x < 4.2. The result indicates that scrapbbok are appropriate for Grade XI of SMA students. The researcher used test to know the students' writing skill achievement based on the media used and the test was done twice; pre-test and post-test; pre-test and post-test. Then, t-test was used to analyze the data. The result of the data above is the value of t-test was the value of t-test was higher t table (12,21 > 12,96) at the level significance 0.05 for two tailed and degree of freedom (df) = 22-2 = 20. It means that Scrapbook significantly affects the students' writing skill achievement.

1. INTRODUCTION

Using appropriate learning media in teaching learning process can motivate students' interest in the learning language. Media in learning process gives advantages to make learning more attractive, material learning more clearly, learning methods have more variation. Media assisted teachers in the process of delivering information to the students because the media can act as a tool in the learning process and learning resources for students. Media are one of the means of communication to convey the message from the sender to the receiver. Media applied in education would be very helpful in the learning process. Media used in learning process is referred to media of learning.

Dewi (2019) states that Media is a facilities that should be utilized maximally due to develop the student's motivation in learning. Learning tools basically defined as all tools that have a function to help the teacher to deliver learning material to the students in order to achieve the learning goal.

In the development of education at the present time, there are many kinds of media that can be applied in language teaching. One of them is scrapbook. Scrapbook is one of the visual media which makes the students easier in getting in getting the material in learning (Wahyu, 2015). Meanwhile, Mulvey and Cullen (2009) stated that scrapbook is wonderful media in which the students post photos and embellishment in it.

In line with this, Nedved (2012) pointed out that scrapbook is an interesting media for both students and teacher. He added that scrapbook helps to create a motivational environment. Furthermore Mohamed et.al.(2003) stated that scrapbook has positive effects to improve students' inventory of word and phrases.

In scrapbook, many pictures are given to stimulate the students' imagination and fantasy on abstract things. It also provides familiar words which students would easily understand. Well-illustrated pop-up books can help them to understand the content. Students' characteristics matched well with this medium so they can write in English enjoyable, attractive, active and creative.

Based on pre-observation done in SMA Sains Plus Tahfidz Qur'an Al Ammar, it showed that the English teacherstill used the conventional method in teaching learning process then it influences the activeness of students. Since, students get bored and unenthusiastic in mastering English descriptive text. The teacher mostly used textbook media in their learning process, such textbooks. Those textbooks is ordinary used for students. I think it is not really interesting enough for students. Scrapbook would be a new innovation in learning English for students and teachers. If the teacher tries to apply Scrapbook in their learning process, I believe that it gave impact on students' interest in learning process especially English.

Based on the fact above, the researcher is interested to carry out research entitled "Development of Scrapbook for Teaching Descriptive Tets at SMA Sains Plus Tahfidz Qur'an Al Ammar", to describe the results of validation and to describe the development scrapbook for teaching descriptive texts

RESEARCH METHOD

The Research and Development study (R&D) was a research method used to develop a product approach by adapting Borg and Gall Model, and the result of validation from the product. The research subjects were 22 students consist of 10 male students and 12 female students in the eleventh grade students of SMA Sains Plus Tahfidz Qur'an Al Ammar.

The data obtained from the observation and interviews were analyzed qualitatively, and those obtained from the questionnaires were analyzed quantitatively.

The results of data assessment included in the calculation of the score table in accordance with the application criteria.

From the table score, it was obtained that result of the both the tests in the class, the lowest score for pre-test was 60 and the highest score was 75 while the lowest score for post-test was 70 and the highest score was 85. The purpose of the main field test in R & D cycle was to determine whether the product under development met its performance objectives. Generally an experimental design was used to answer this question.
